NADCO Meeting November 19, 2015 Agenda

1. President's Report

- The Holiday Breakfast will be held at the Garden City Hotel on Friday,

 gift (cute or humorous) costing less than \$10 if you wish to take part in the
 gift exchange.

 Senders will then compile the information and make it available to all members. Google Forms were recommended as an easy tool for requesting, collecting, and reporting information.

2. President-Elect's Report

NADCOs January "STEAM Workshop" meeting at the Cradle of Aviation
Museum will be extended in length. The event will include keynote speaker
Doug Llewellyn and a variety of hands on activities. Members are encouraged
to bring with them guest(s) from their science departments and the new
science standards.

3. Treasurer's Report

• "Guest Reporter" Janine Sampino reported that our current balance is approximately \$11,000.

4. Sector Reports

Janine also reported out on Southern Sector discussions about:

- On-line testing (conference call with NYSED—sampler to be available in December)
- On-line textbooks
- Rockville Centre's offer to share writing workshop information

Charlie Leone reported out on Northern Sector discussions about:

- Group SLOs
- General approval of hardship waivers
- Regents/Common Core testing and curriculum plans
- Disconnects between Algebra II Trigonometry and Common Core Algebra II, and strategies for sequencing of Trigonometry, an significant SAT topic absent from the CC Algebra II course outline
- Heroin overdose epidemic and curricular strategies to address it
- Middle and High School implementation of RTI

- AP Capstone—several districts have been approved and are moving forward with ETS's answer to IB. (AP Capstone schools/districts include East Williston, Hewlett, Plainview-Old Bethpage, Levittown, Island Trees, and Wantagh.)
 Barbara Bauer suggested a capstone presentation for a future NADCO meeting.
- 5. Legal Updates: Chris Powers and Cheryl Monticciolo from Ingerman Smith LLP
 - -Opening quote channeling Rosanna Rosannadana: "It's always something with you guys. If it's not one thing, it's another."
 - -Slides 3-8
 - NYSUT's past strategy has been to prolong the hearing process. The new regulations expedite matters.
 - At NYSSBA's request, there is now a 125 calendar day limit on the submission of testimony from the time that charges are approved by a board of education. This has created pressure for settlement agreements such as resignations in lieu of charges/§3020-a hearings.
 - Hearing officers are now required to make decisions/move the process along more quickly.
 - Advice: districts are better served by bringing charges in September than in June. The timing of board adoption of charges must be considered carefully.
 - §3020-a provides for unpaid suspension following a probable cause hearing in cases involving the physical/sexual abuse of a student. This hearing must be adjudicated by a 3rd party.
 - Holt letters as "notice events" are valuable if there is a sense that charges will not be upheld.
 - The timeline for cases charging student abuse has been shortened and limits on adjournments are now in place.
 - -Slide 9: Proceedings for the expedited revocation of certification are now in place. This does not apply to expiration of certification.
 - -Slide 10: Alternative methods (such as via video) are now permitted for child testimony. If not granted, the hearing room should be set up to limit/reduce/prevent contact between the child and the accused teacher.
 - -Slide 11: Discovery is now reciprocal by statute. This requires the accused teacher and his/her representative to provide information/documents/witness lists prior to the hearing. This facilitates an expedited process.
 - -Slide 12: Hearing officers are no longer required to consider a district's attempt to "correct" teacher behavior unless asked to do so. Districts should document <u>everything</u>. Ingerman Smith/Chris Powers recommend proceeding with §3020-a only when termination is a possible outcome.
 - -Slides 13-18: §3020-b
 - §3020-b is a new section regarding termination for ineffective teaching.
 - Districts have discretion about whether or not to charge teachers who have received 2 overall ratings of "ineffective."
 - District must charge teachers who have received 3 overall ratings of "ineffective."
 - There is no limit on charging "incompetency" even if a teacher has received "effective" rating(s).
 - The hearing panel has been eliminated if favor of a single hearing officer.

- The legal standard required for termination is "prima fascia" evidence. Ineffective ratings are just cause for removal absent extraordinary circumstances.
- Shortened time frames for these charges: 90 days for 2 "ineffectives", 30 days for 3 "ineffectives".
- This revised process may increase the number of removals.

-Slides 19-28: §3012-d

- The system is unpredictable. The timeline for implementation was reviewed.
- At present, it would be best for districts to have an approved plan in place by March of 2015.
- The application portal has been simplified. Many requirements for verbiage have been removed.
- SLOs are not subject to required negotiations and can be mandated by the district even if negotiated under prior applications.
- There is a contradiction re State and local use of SLO's with regard to student attendance data—required/used by one, not permitted by the other.
- It is better to start with lower expectations for student growth and to be required to change than to start "high" and risk not being able to make downward adjustments.
- Backup SLOs are required for all teachers.
- Teachers with fewer than 16 rated students will not receive a State score.
- Districts may decide on the "magic number" which triggers the backup SLO.
- "Form H" (re local assessment) does not required districts to submit exams, only assurances that they measure growth appropriately. Many districts already have approvals.
- Some NADCO members suggest using MGPs to establish school measures.
- No new information was available regarding the use of Algebra I in addition to Math 8 for middle school math teacher ratings.
- Base on interpretation of the phrase "to the extent practicable", districts can use a second assessment for 4^{th} through 8^{th} grade teachers (or other subgroups).
- <u>A SECOND STUDENT GROWTH MEASURE BASED ON SCHOOL RESULTS MAY BE USED</u> WITHOUT THE "DOUBLE INEFFECTIVE" CONSEQUENCE.
- The BOCES dashboard allows for adjustment with optional scores.
- ONE PERSON CAN COMPLETE BOTH OBSERVATIONS IF S/HE HAS A DIFFERENT BEDS CODE THAT THE BUILDING TO WHICH A TEACHER IS ASSIGNED.

-Slides 29-35: Probationary Appointments

- Provisions are in place to reduce tenure by estoppels, especially in cases where a district is awaiting State
 growth scores.
- Tenure may <u>not</u> be granted while awaiting a teacher's final APPR score.
- Districts should ensure that "non-observables" are considered.
- The requirement to consider APPR has been eliminated.
- -Slides 36-37: Opt Out Requests—Parents do not have the right to dictate curriculum which includes testing. Local opt outs are strongly discouraged.



-Slides 38-43 address transgender issues. Time did not permit a review of these slides.
